The NYC Civic Corps, run by NYC Service, unites a diverse group of professionals in a year-long term of service to assist nonprofit organizations and City agencies in increasing their organizational capacity to engage volunteers and building sustainable service initiatives. NYC Service dispatches teams of NYC Civic Corps members to host sites, where they drive volunteer activity to New York City's most pressing needs in economic opportunity, environment and clean energy, education, and health.

## REQUIREMENTS:

To join the NYC Civic Corps, individuals must:

- be U.S. citizens or permanent residents,
- hold a Bachelor's Degree by August 2011, and
- be willing to commit to a full-time position (40 hours per week) beginning late August 2011 and ending June 30, 2012.

## BENEFITS:

In return for their service, corps members receive:

- a monthly living stipend of \$1,270 (pre-tax),
- basic health benefits,
- a \$5,350 Segal AmeriCorps Educational Award, and
- monthly professional development and support from NYC Service.

Please note that this program is contingent on receiving federal funding administered by the Corporation for National and Community Service and the New York State Commission for National and Community Service.
