Who is at risk for glaucoma?

- **Everyone** is at risk for glaucoma.
- Those who are at a higher risk include: adults 45 years and older (although young adults can also get glaucoma); people of African-American, Hispanic, or Asian descent; have a family history of glaucoma; use steroids; have suffered an eye injury; diabetics; people who are near-sighted; have high blood pressure.
