## HEAD AND NECK CANCER

This type of cancer can occur in the nasal passages, mouth, throat, voice box, or skin. There are thousands of new cases of head and neck cancer each year, many of which can be cured. The best chance for a cure is when the cancer is found early.

## THE WARNING SIGNS

Frequent nose bleeds; ongoing nasal congestion; persistent sore or growth in mouth or throat; constant earaches; lasting change in voice; bloody phlegm lasting several days; lump in neck lasting more than two weeks; changes in skin or mole; or problems swallowing.

## FREE SCREENING

- Ten-minute exam by doctors at Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center, to look for signs of head and neck cancer.
- Counseling on quitting smoking.
- Nutritional advice on cancer-preventive diets.

## WHO SHOULD ATTEND

- Adults who smoke, drink, or spend a lot of time in the sun.
- Adults who notice any of the warning signs of head and neck cancer.
